



Four Wheel Drive Skills Courses for 2011



Basic 4WD Skills

The Basic 4WD Skills course has been developed to provide club drivers with the general four wheel drive knowledge & skills needed to safely participate in Club 4WD activities. All materials are supplied, apart from vehicle costs and camping fees.

(Vehicle permits and barge fees for Assessment Day #1 will be covered by course fees)

The competencies covered are:

SRODRV001B – Drive and Recover a 4WD vehicle
SROODR002A – Plan Outdoor Recreation Activities
TDTB497B – Carry Out Vehicle Inspection

Participants in this course must ensure that the club minimum recovery equipment is carried at all times. Each vehicle must have a UHF radio (handhelds OK).

The course is practical and aimed at the needs of recreational four wheel drivers. Successful participants will be awarded a Statement of Attainment in partial completion of a Certificate III in Outdoor Recreation through Four Wheel Drive Queensland Training.

This course is considered equivalent to either **MNMEGS312A - Drive and recover a four wheel drive vehicle** or the newer **RIIVEH305A - Drive and maintain a four wheel drive vehicle** (required by BHP Billiton). These units are required by the Resources, Mining & Infrastructure Sector to drive and operate a 4WD vehicle on all mining sites. It is also considered equivalent to **TLIC2507B Operate a 4WD Vehicle** used by the Transport, Logistics and Construction Sector. Mappings showing equivalence are available in required.
